21:00	Separating from wife left me broken hearted. I had to learn to talk. I decided to take kids for you and for me, didn't have a plan.
22:45	I got as much out of it as you two did – without the gravity you two gave me, I would have self-destructed.
23:45	Starting relationship with rose – something romantic about how she stood behind screen door.
25:00	Hardest thing about raising teens – taking the bait and arguing with both of you. (J)-I hope I won't get back what I gave to you. I hope I can act like you as a parent.
28:00	I was in denial about Rose getting breast cancer, I hid in my work. She saw me as an ostrich with my hand in sand, in denial, until the day she died. Caring for her physically was draining.
29:30	Life's ups and downs; life adapted based on my parents' example, by the time I was 15 I'd been pallbearer three times, and been to many other funerals. I got sad and went to counseling for depression.
32:00	Got good counseling; life like a river with terrible rapids and calm pools, always have beauty
